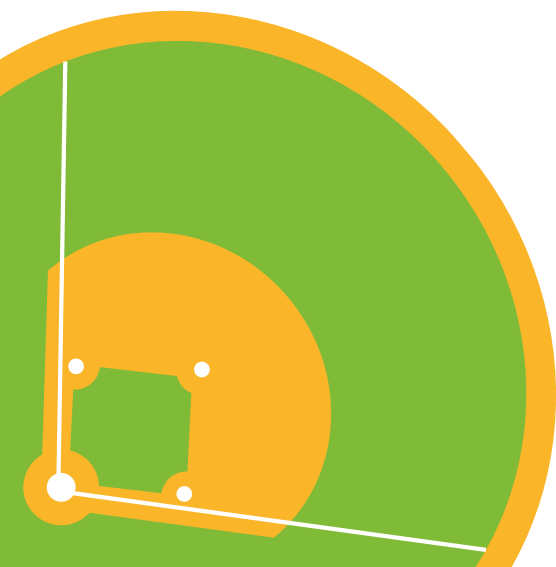

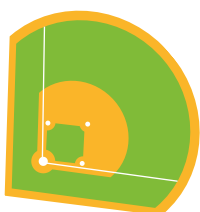

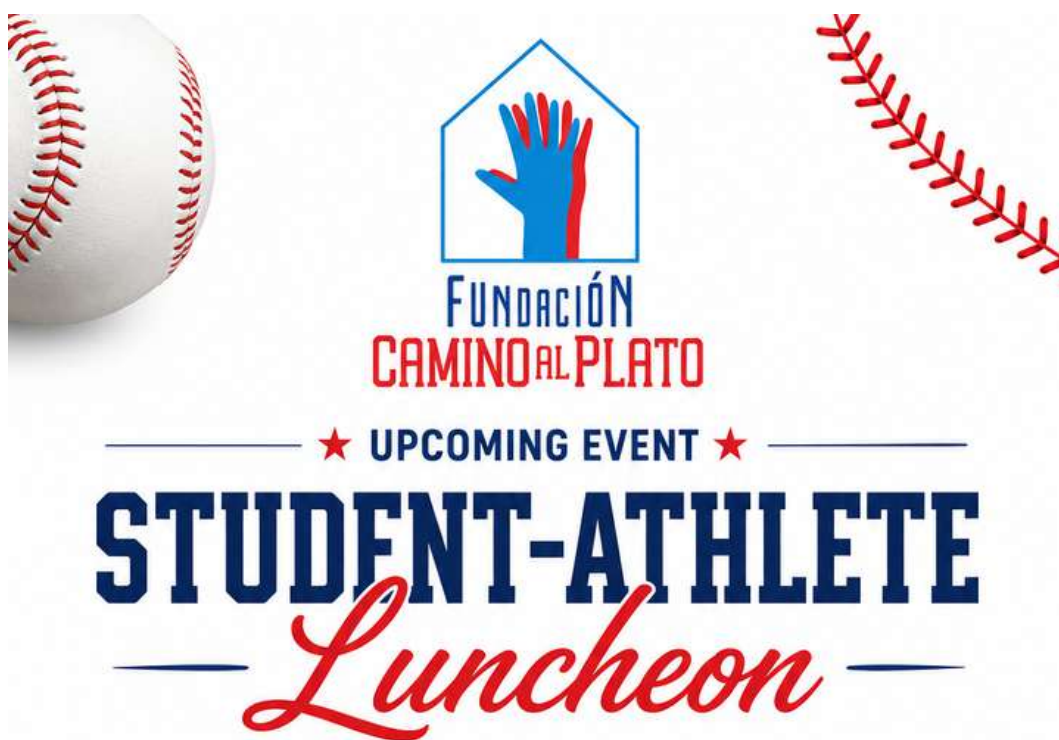
EXPANDING OUR MISSION, CREATING NEW OPPORTUNITIES
